PROCHLORPERAZINE MALEATE

'Stemetil' is advocated for the prevention of attacks of migraine or to lessen their frequency or severity; for this purpose it is given continuously in a low dosage. It may also be used, in a higher dosage, at the prodromal stage, with a view to aborting the attack or relieving the symptoms. Choice of these two methods of use will depend on the frequency of the attacks. The drug is of prophylactic use in those cases wherein attacks of true migraine are induced by emotional upsets such as travelling or excitement. This is not to be confused with headache of psychogenic origin which is not true migraine and appears to be resistant to the drug. 'Stemetil' is also indicated in labyrinthine disorders including Ménière's syndrome, giddiness of other origins (except when due to streptomycin), and vomiting. Possible applications in psychiatry are being studied.





Associateship

Any registered (or provisionally registered) medical practitioner is eligible for admission as an associate, provided he gives an undertaking that if he enters or remains in general practice he will continue approved postgraduate study and will uphold and promote the aims of the College to the best of his ability.

(A provisionally registered medical practitioner shall cease to be an associate if he fails to obtain registration

within two years of qualification.)

Membership

The Council of the College admits to membership, after consultation with the Board of Censors, registered medical practitioners who have been qualified for not less than seven years and have been engaged in general practice for not less than five years or, as an associate, for three years.

An applicant for membership must:—(1) be proposed and seconded by two members of the College—not being in partnership with each other. (2) Submit evidence concerning his practice, experience, and academic and administrative achievements. (3) Submit himself to an interview with the board of censors, if required. (4) Give an undertaking that he will continue approved postgraduate study while he remains in active general practice, and that he will uphold and promote the aims of the College to the best of his ability. The Council may seek supporting evidence of his eligibility from his sponsors, the board of the faculty in whose area he resides, and, if so required, from others whom he or his sponsors may choose to appoint.

Entrance Fees and Subscriptions

Associates make an annual subscription of £2 2s. 0d. but pay no entrance fee. Members are required to pay an entrance fee on admission of £10 10s. 0d. and make an annual subscription of £3 3s. 0d.
