Throughout the book stress is laid on the diversity of opinion in morality. Alternative viewpoints are presented on each issue, value-judgments being left to the reader.

A notable feature of the book is that all theoretical arguments are illustrated with examples of actual clinical situations. A final chapter surveys the moral questions arising in abortion, human experimentation, organ transplantation and terminal care.

Appendix material includes international medical and nursing ethical codes.
