GENERAL PRACTICE INTRODUCTORY RESEARCH COURSE

Is the *buzz* missing from your day to day work in the practice?

With your experience in primary care would you challenge some of the things you learned in medical school or are even now reading in the journals?

Why not think about organising a research project within your own practice?

UWCM in conjunction with the research committee of the Welsh Council of RCGP gives you the opportunity to acquire basic research skills by attending a five day, residential, general practice-based, research course. This will cover aspects of epidemiology, study design and the development of a research protocol from an unstructured idea. Venue will be decided in accordance with geographical response, and could be in Mid-Wales. The introductory course will help prepare doctors to undertake practice-based research.

The course will run from: 19th-23rd September 1994.

Cost of the course including accommodation will be approximately £250. PGEA will be sought.

GENERAL PRACTICE RESEARCH COURSE - LEADING TO THE DEGREE OF M.PHIL

In ADDITION to the above, the Department of General Practice UWCM gives the opportunity for a small number of doctors to undertake a two year part time MPhil degree in general practice research. Unlike most MSc courses which entail several lengthy modules away from the practice, this higher degree course is designed for research to be carried out in the participant's own practice and involves one day per month at the department in Cardiff. Personal and departmental support from individual tutors and members of the Department of General Practice will be given, and a final dissertation presented for the thesis. Attendance at the five day introductory course outlined above, or its equivalent, will be required.




