VISIT OF MEMBERS OF THE ROYAL AUSTRALIAN COLLEGE OF GENERAL PRACTITIONERS—1970

On 5 April some 90 members of the Royal Australian College with their ladies will arrive in this country. On the evening of Monday, 6 April a reception and buffet has been arranged for them at 14 Princes Gate, London. (These dates are subject to confirmation.) During the next few days they will travel to Aberdeen to attend the spring general meeting of the College and the various clinical meetings, symposia, seminars and social functions which will be held. A civic and a university reception have been arranged for them in Aberdeen and they will be invited to attend the faculty dinner.

On Sunday, 12 April Dr W. S. Gardner will deliver the William Pickles lecture on *Training* to be a doctor, omissions and their consequences.
