Legal Aspects of Medical Practice concentrates on giving the information that a doctor should have to guide him in his dealings with legal medicine. The topics discussed include the doctor's responsibility towards his patient and profession; the framework of British and Scottish legal systems; the role of the coroner, and the doctor's duty at the scene of death.

Practical advice is given in procedure, examining of the dead body and recognition of the probable cause of death. These are considered more fully, together with important allied issues such as the battered child and sudden infant death.

A final section sets out the principal recommendations of the long awaited Brodrick Report on Death Certification and Coroners.

## The chance of a good social and family life

The RAF is a young community, with a full and active social life. There are facilities for almost every kind of sport and, which is most important, the time to enjoy your family while you are still a young man. Living conditions are excellent. If you are single you live in the Officers' Mess, which has all the amenities of a good hotel. If you are married, you will nearly always have a furnished house that goes with the job; rent for this is very modest; and it can save a large financial outlay at the beginning of your career.



General Practice? With a difference. At this RAF Clinic, in the busy town of Limassol, in Cyprus, almost all the patients are women and children (specially children). Staff is 7 doctors, each with his (or her) own panel of patients; and 5 dentists. There are 5 SRN Nurses, and 7 Health Visitors. Next door is the RAF's Child Guidance Clinic, with psychiatrist, educational psychologist and speech therapist.

### A realistic pay scale

Pay is based on the average earnings of a civilian GP. Immediately after full registration, the present basic salary is £3668; after 5 years it rises to £4424; after 13 years to £5453. There are various other allowances; for instance, with children at boarding school the figures are £330 (net) for one child, £723 (net) for two children, £1194 (net) for three children. There are tax-free gratuities of £1500 after 3 years, or £3000 after 5 years. After service of 16 years or more there is a pension, payable for life, and a generous terminal grant.





#### Indications


