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
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What do you prescribe for the to bronchodilators

In early episodic asthma, treatment with oral or aerosol bronchodilators is usually all that is required.




Cross section of a bronchiole showing

However, as the disease progresses, inflammatory changes including oedema of the bronchial mucosa and hypersecretion of mucus frequently occur to such an extent that bronchodilator drugs alone are not able to give adequate control.


Unless appropriate treatment is undertaken, the patient's condition is likely to deteriorate due to plugging of oedematous bronchioles with inspissated mucus.

In the past, the most effective treatment for these cases has been the administration of systemic steroids or corticotrophins. But the side effects resulting from the prolonged use of these products can be serious and are always worrying to doctor and patient alike.

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

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

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Dosage: Adults 250 mg three times a day. Children – up to 10 years: 125 mg three times a day. In the case of severe infections the dosage should be doubled.

Presentation: Amoxil capsules 250 mg. Amoxil syrup 250 mg/5 ml, 100 ml bottle. Amoxil syrup 125 mg/5 ml, 100 ml bottle. Amoxil Paediatric Suspension 125 mg/1.25 ml, 20 ml bottle with pipette. Amoxil presentations contain amoxycillin as the trihydrate.

Contra-indication: Amoxil is a penicillin and should not be given to penicillin-hypersensitive patients.


