Any similarity between Burinex and other diuretics is purely beneficial (and so are the differences.)

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Burinex* is a new chemical entity, being derived from metanilamide; it is quite distinct from any available diuretic. Despite careful search by such techniques as autoradiography, it has not been possible to detect any metabolite in the human.

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Burinex differs in pharmacological potency, with a dose about one-fortieth that of any other short-acting dirretic. After oral administration, diuresis normally begins at 30 minutes — "peaks" at 90 minutes and is largely complete within three hours.

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Burinex has been shown to be of value in clinical practice, not only for the seriously ill patient where a rapid diuresis is required but also for maintenance, where the predictable effect can be utilised to fit the patient's domestic circumstances and work routine. During long term treatment Burinex has proved to be very well tolerated.

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
