RCGP COURSES 1992 - PGEA APPROVED

Personnel Management Course (20/21 May, 13/14 October) — A two day course which aims to give general practitioners and practice managers an appreciation of the processes and skills required to improve organizational performance.

Data Handling for Medical Audit (16/17 June, 19/20 November) — Two days training in the technical skills involved in collecting and digesting medical audit information suitable for both interested general practitioners, their practice staff, and those involved with medical audit advisory groups.

Computer Appreciation Course (24/25 April, 18/19 September) — A two day course, aimed at making general practitioners and practice staff aware of the rapid developments currently taking place in micro-computing. Hands-on experience provided.
