# HELP US TO HELP THOSE WITH MARFAN SYNDROME

Marfan Syndrome is in 75% of cases an inherited disorder of connective tissue, 25% occurring as new mutations.

There is a 50/50 chance with each pregnancy that the gene may be inherited.

The incidence is thought to be greater than 1 in 5,000.

# \* SALIENT FEATURES \*

### Ocular:

Subluxation or dislocation of lens, myopia and unstable refraction, detachment of retina, strabismus, glaucoma.

### Dental:


High-arched plate, crowding of teeth.

# Cardiovascular:

Dilatation of ascending and sometimes descending aorta, incompetence of aortic and mitral valves, aneurysm and dissection of aorta.

### Skeletal:

Tall thin physique, disproportionately long limbs, fingers and toes, lax ankles, flat feet, spinal curvature, abnormally shaped chest (with pigeon or funnel deformity), armspan usually greater than height, joint hypermobility or contractures, stretch marks (striae).


